

Shorewood Now in Drought Warning Response Phase; Expanded Watering Restrictions Hours & Odd-Even Days

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has moved Shorewood and the Mississippi Headwater watershed into a drought warning response phase due to prolonged dry weather. Droughts have a negative effect on ground water supplies and lake and stream levels.

During the drought warning phase, the Minnesota Statewide Drought

Plan specifies that public water suppliers implement water use reduction actions with a goal of reducing water use to 50% above January levels.

The City of Shorewood has expanded the regular water conservation measures to the following:

- Residents are allowed to irrigate on odd or even days. Even addresses can only water on even-numbered days, odd addresses can only water on odd-numbered days.
- Residents are allowed to irrigate before 10:00 am and after 5:00 pm on their assigned day.

Conserving Water During a Drought



Don't overwater your lawn. A heavy rain eliminates the need for watering for up to two weeks. Most grass needs only one inch of water weekly.



In extreme drought, allow lawns to die in favor of preserving trees and large shrubs.



Detect and repair all leaks in irrigation systems. Set sprinklers to water the lawn or garden only – not the street or sidewalk.



Adult Use Cannabis, THC Sales & Related Activity in Shorewood

The Legislature approved adult use cannabis products in the 2023 legislative session. Shorewood City Council reviewed and discussed the adult use cannabis law at its meeting on June 26, 2023. The following is a summary of the implications of the new law for Shorewood. The information contained in this article is subject to revision.

Hemp Derived THC

- The City's 2022 moratorium prohibiting the sale of THC products has now expired.
- Low dose (<0.3%) hemp derived THC sales are now allowed in Shorewood. At this time, the City is not regulating sales.
- THC products are available to those 21 years of age and older. Sales are limited to 5mg/serving and 50mg/package. Products are required to be located behind the counter and locked. No artificially derived ingredients are currently allowed except Delta 8 and 9.
- If violations are observed, there is a complaint form on the Minnesota Department of Health's webpage that may be submitted.
- By Oct 1, retailers of hemp derived THC must register with the Minnesota Department of Health.
- In 2025, hemp derived THC retailers will also need to obtain a license from the State Office of Cannabis Management and register with the City.

Adult Use Cannabis

- Use of cannabis by adults 21 and older is legal in Minnesota as of Aug 1. The sale of cannabis products is not currently legal in Minnesota but is expected to become legal in 2025.
- In 2025, the State Office of Cannabis Management will issue licenses for retail sales of cannabis products through the State Office of Cannabis Management. Registration with the City of Shorewood will be required. Zoning regulations will apply to sales.
- The City is currently studying zoning regulations regarding where and when cannabis sales may occur in Shorewood. It is also considering prohibitions regarding smoking in public places, such as parks.

Official City Documents

The City of Shorewood has an electronic archive of city documents that date back to 1953. The City has integrated and centralized this document storage for the convenience of document review and retrieval.

Official documents that may be searched for include agenda meeting packets for city council, planning commission and park commission meetings, council and commission meeting minutes, city ordinances and resolutions, annual city budget and audit information, city comprehensive plans, and city newsletters, along with many other official city documents.

Once in the City's Laserfiche system there is a simple search form that retrieves documents with the keywords you have entered.



2024 Budget Process

The City has been working on its preliminary 2024 operating budget and property tax levy since June. A City Council budget work session occurred on August 14, and a second budget work session is scheduled for Monday, September 11. It is anticipated that the City Council will adopt the 2024 preliminary budget and property tax levy at its September 25 meeting. Following adoption of the preliminary budget and property tax levy in September, the City will certify the 2024 preliminary property tax levy to Hennepin County by September 30.

Property owners will receive truth-in-taxation notices in November from the County, showing proposed 2024 property taxes. The City Council will hold a truth-in-taxation public meeting on the proposed 2024 budget and property tax levy, tentatively scheduled as part of its regularly scheduled City Council meeting on Monday, December 11.

The Council may adopt its final payable 2024 property tax levy and 2024 budget at the December 11 meeting and will certify the 2024 final property tax levy to Hennepin County on or before December 28.
