It is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationary flag staffs in the open. However, when a patriotic effect is desired, the flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. 
## City photo contest

## Recycling Study Coming to Some Neighborhoods

Recycling can be confusing! We want to know how to best help educate residents on this complicated topic. To give us insight, Shorewood's Recycling Committee will be conducting a "Feet on the Street" recycling program.

This summer, a team of city staff and volunteers will collect data from some residential recycling carts to get an idea of what items are often misplaced. We'll be looking at the "contamination rate" for recycling carts, which

is the amount of non-recyclable items found in the bins. Using the findings on commonly misplaced items to provide education for residents throughout the following six weeks. After the targeted education period, we will conduct a follow-up waste sort to see how sorting has improved. Results will be shared in the August issue of the Shore Report newsletter.

Neighborhoods being evaluated will be notified, but not given dates as we do not want behaviors to change for the

"audit". Keep recycling as you normally would to help us see where the confusion might be.

Thank you for helping us keep our city recycling valuable and clean! We look forward to digging through recycling carts soon!

## Jumping Worms Make Plant Exchanges Challenging

Jumping worms are an invasive species. The Minnesota DNR wants gardeners to be on the lookout and to report any jumping worms on properties. As their name implies, they jump, wiggle and are very active. They live in the leaf litter and the top few inches of soil on the forest floor. The worms change the soil texture

to appear like coffee grounds, strip the soil of nutrients and can kill plants.

Prevention is the only known way to manage them. Do not bring soil from any other property. If you are trading plants with friends, wash the roots at the property of origination, re-pot in potting soil, or bring to your garden bare

root. The eggs are very difficult to detect. Jumping worms should be disposed of in the garbage. Do not release them into the environment.

## Mapping Prejudice and Shorewood Properties

Recently a documentary recalled Jim Crow of the North (available on PBS.org) revealed a concentrated effort by past developers between about 1920 through 1948 to impose segregation in Minnesota by placing restrictive covenants on properties. These covenants prohibited selling property to black people and also sometimes other minorities or religious groups. Later, the federal government used the presence of these racial covenants to redline neighborhoods where black people lived to refuse home loans in these areas. Such covenants are illegal to

enforce today, but many deeds still have them. For more information you can research the issue by searching "Mapping Prejudice Minnesota" and "Just deeds.org" in your web browser. These websites have a mapping prejudice tool to help you determine if your property was affected.

A few properties in Shorewood have such covenants, but most properties were developed either before covenants were used or after the covenants were made illegal. Please remember that current homeowners alive today were not involved in placing these covenants on property.

Homeowners interested in

disavowing these covenants from their deeds can find more information by searching "Real estate recording information Hennepin County" in your web browser. You will find instructions to disavow covenants present on your property. There is no fee to record documents to disavow restrictive covenants. Noatrics are available at city hall. It is recommended calling to make a notary appointment, 952.960.7900.
