| Black Hills Spruce <i>Picea glauca densata</i> 🌲 | Shapely "Christmas tree" type evergreen, with short, blue-green needles. Shears easily. Useful as a specimen, hedge, or windbreak. Best in full sun, but tolerates light shade. | 35-45' | 25-30' | | Full Sun | Blue-green | | 3-6 | Ct #10 60 lbs | \$102.45 |
| Blue Beech (Musclewood) <i>Carpinus caroliniana</i> 🌳 | This prized native tree is known for its attractive blue-gray bark that is fluted with long sinewy ridges, as well it's very hard wood. Used as an understock for some newer cultivars on the market. Adapts to a wide range of soil textures, moisture levels, drainage patterns and pH levels. | 20-30' | 30' | Spreading, irregular | Full Sun to Full Shade | Green | Orange to red | 3-9 | Ct #10 60 lbs | \$115.45 |
| Common Hackberry <i>Celtis occidentalis</i> 🌳 | Hackberry is known for its attractive bark that is corky and rough in texture. The bright green elm-like foliage turns to a soft yellow in the fall, and the fruits are relished by wildlife. With a round open form, it grows at a moderate to rapid rate. Extremely hardy, and adaptable to a range of urban environments including alkaline soils, drought, and windy conditions. | 50-70' | 50' | Spreading, rounded | Full Sun | Bright green | Soft yellow | 2-7 | Ct #25 125 lbs | \$193.60 |
| Harvest Golden Linden <i>Tilia x mongolica 'Harvest Gold'</i> 🌳 | This hybrid of <i>Tilia cordata</i> and <i>Tilia mongolica</i> was developed in Manitoba, Canada. It is hardier than Norlin linden and resistant to sunscald injury and leaf spot. An excellent boulevard tree, it has lovely exfoliating bark, golden buds and consistent fall color. | Heritage® River Birch <i>Betula nigra 'Cully'</i> 🌳 | This vigorous grower has exfoliating bark that is lighter than river birch, ranging from tan to creamy white to parchment white. While it tolerates wet, poorly drained soils, it does well in upland soils, and is resistant to bronze birch borer. Clumps have three or more stems. | 45-50' | 30-35' | Oval | Full Sun | Glossy green | Golden yellow | 4-8 | Ct #10 Cl 60 lbs | \$113.75 |
| Ironwood <i>Ostrya virginiana</i> 🌳 | This slow-growing, hardy, medium-sized tree has slender, spreading branches. Hop-like fruits add interest in late summer and the persistent brown leaves add winter interest. Good for street or lawn, it is tolerant of dry locations. 2008 GreatPlants® for the Great Plains winner. | 30-50' | 25' | Oval to rounded | Full Sun | Bright green | Golden yellow | 3-9 | Ct #5 25 lbs | \$54.85 |
| Ivory Silk® Japanese Lilac Tree <i>Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk'</i> 🌳 | Sturdy and showcase a compact habit, making it a top choice for street trees. Flowers at an early age and blooms in May to June with creamy white flower plumes that can grow to ten to twelve inches long. Provides a lovely fragrance for your landscape. | Lustre™ Allegheny Serviceberry <i>Amelanchier laevis 'Rogers'</i> 🌳 | A small understory tree, has an upright and open form. Flower profusely with drooping white clusters of flowers each spring. Edible purplish-black fruit follows in late summer attracts birds.
