





Highway 7 Crash Data January – June 2025

In 2025, the South Lake Minnetonka Police Department (SLMPD) and other law enforcement agencies along the Highway 7 corridor received a \$450,000 grant to improve safety on Highway 7. With these funds, these agencies, together known as the Highway 7 Safety Coalition, led a collaborative effort to conduct traffic enforcement, public outreach, and the utilization of AI technologies to better understand dangerous driving behaviors along the Hwy 7 Corridor between St. Louis Park and St. Bonifacius.

South Lake Minnetonka Police Sergeant Adam Moore analyzed crash data to compare the 2025 grant period (January-June 2025) with data collected between the same months between 2020-2024 to find an average. Total crashes during the January to June 2025 period are down 18.1% from average and there were zero fatal crashes (the average is just under one fatal crash per year from January to June 2020-2024). Additionally, crashes with distracted driving as a factor are down 54.8% from average.
